Financial Aid: St. Mary students who qualify for tuition assistance will receive over \$300,000 in EITC/OSTC funding through BLOCS, Foundation for Catholic Education, and the Children's Scholarship Fund Philadelphia organizations; St. Mary Interparochial Tuition Assistance and Scholarship Program also awards students in need.

Achievements: Class of 2023 received tuition assistance or scholarships to high school, totaling over \$930,000, including two Xavier Scholarships to St. Joseph's Preparatory School, and Academic Merit Scholarships.
